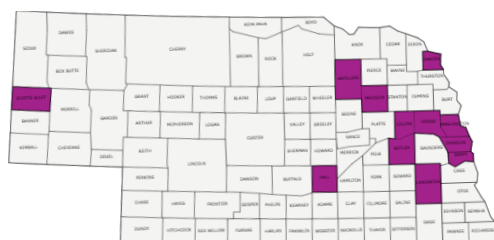

A donation garden project that aims to increase nutrition security and promote healthy food access for families and individuals who are food insecure.

For the tenth consecutive year, Nebraska Extension's Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program-Education (SNAP-Ed) awarded funding to 12 communities across the state through its Growing Together Nebraska project. Fresh, locally grown produce valued at \$69,608 was donated to those in need across 40 food pantries and emergency food distribution sites.

- 45 community partners supported local projects
- Over \$3,400 in-kind donations to improve the health of Nebraskans
- Produce recipients learned about fruits and vegetables, food preparation/cooking, food safety, gardening, MyPlate food groups, fiber-rich foods, and food shopping and resource management
